- I            Meeting was called to order at 7:00p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
- II           Agenda was approved as presented. J Hendricks made a motion to approve the agenda as presented and R Kruzel seconded it. Motion carried.
- III          Minutes for the March 4, 2020 meeting were approved as presented. L Fineout made a motion to approve the minutes as presented and R Kruzel seconded it. Motion carried.
- IV          The Treasurer's report was presented with receipts of \$8642.54 for March 2020. G Kruskie made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report as presented for March 2020, L Fineout seconded it. Motion carried.
- V           Bills paid in March 2020 came to the amount of \$9210.20. R Kruzel made a motion to approve the March 2020 expenditures and L Fineout seconded it. Motion carried.

- VIII          Correspondence:  
              Lauer Pest Control sent in a letter to spray the trees again this year. R Kruzel will look into what the cost is this year and if it is with-in the range of last year we will have it done.

              Spring Clean-up is scheduled for June 6<sup>th</sup>. G Kruskie will look into whether the date is available. If so we will schedule it, with the idea that if the COVID-19 is prevalent in this area we will schedule it for a later time in the year.

A lengthy discussion took place regarding the M-119 roadway and the issue with the runoff from the highway that is causing mudslide effects in the Sequoia Association. G Kruskie has had discussions with Brian Gutowski of the ECRC regarding the issue. R Gutowski has volunteered to start talks with the State of Michigan, and include G Kruskie when the time seems fit to do so. It is the boards feeling that no monies of the Readmond Township will be put towards this issue with M-119 and Sequoia Association.

There is going to be a May 5<sup>th</sup> Election, however, it will be a mail-in only election where everyone will vote, if they apply, absentee voters ballot. S Krupa will still need to have a couple of election

workers and hold the same hours as a normal election. S Krupa described the frustrations regarding the state and local governments.

Because of the unknown condition of the future with regards to the public's health due to the COVID-19 L Fineout suggested making a motion to approve future bills to be paid. S Krupa made a motion to approve future payment of bills, if needed, at the clerk and treasurer's discretion, when and if, meetings cannot be held due to emergency cancellations. L Fineout seconded it. Motion carried.

G Kruskie wanted to mention the help that is available thru FEMA regarding the erosion along Lake Michigan in Readmond Township. If there are land owners that have experienced issues with erosion and need help FEMA is available to help thru an insurance program.
